In order to ensure a comprehensive range of perspectives shapes our strategic plan, the Working Group, consisting of myself, Desiree Henthorn (Deputy Principal), Renee Barton (School Board), Luke Slattery (Teacher), Angela Maisey (Admin ESO), Luke Staley (Curriculum ESO/OSHC ESO), Nicole Ross (Curriculum ESO), Ashna Gaonkar (Student School Spirit Leader), Charlie Hone (Student School Leader), and Hadley Pix (Student School Environment & Sustainability Leader), met for the first time this week, with the invaluable guidance of Leanne Muffet from Strategic Matters. This marks an exciting milestone in our journey! Following introductions, Leanne provided insights into the group's role, the process, timeline, Terms of Reference, and the purpose behind crafting a strategic plan. Our discussions shed light on how these efforts will assist in defining the school's long-term objectives.

On Wednesday, May 15, all school staff were invited to a workshop with Leanne, and we are scheduled to meet next Wednesday, May 22, to continue our collaborative efforts. Furthermore, Strategic Matters will closely collaborate with our School Board.

We are fully committed to fostering broad engagement throughout this process, ensuring widespread interest and ownership of this pivotal document, with the bulk of our planning endeavours scheduled for May, June, and July of this year. As part of our inclusive approach, you can anticipate receiving an invitation to participate in an anonymous online survey, providing an avenue for you to share your insights and perspectives.




