



# FROM THE APRIM

Two weekends ago, I was privileged to attend Mass with a number of families here at Our Lady of Victories Church. The reason this Mass was particularly special was that eleven of our children celebrated their First Holy Communion, along with other children in the Glenelg Parish. The celebration ended with a beautiful morning tea with the parishioners afterwards in St Mary's Hall.

Holy Communion is a very special and intimate way to be with Jesus Christ. This very sacred part of the Mass is the ultimate summit for Catholic's who believe we truly have the body and blood Christ with us. The children in the Sacramental Program have spent the previous month learning about the sacredness of Holy Communion. This First Eucharist is such a special moment for them and their families. From this point onwards these children may now be with Christ in this most special way anytime they attend Mass.

Prior to celebrating First Eucharist, these children have been on a journey through each of the Sacraments of initiation. In Term 4 of the school year the program begins with the children learning about Reconciliation. They learn all about the forgiveness given to us through Jesus Christ, no matter what. Knowing that Jesus always forgives us and always loves us regardless of what we have done, is a powerful understanding to have in life.

In the following year, throughout Term 2, the children learn all about the Holy Spirit through the sacrament of Confirmation. Here they come to know the gifts of the Holy Spirit and how, when we use these gifts given to us through the Holy Spirit, we bear fruits for ourselves and for others. A special Mass is celebrated with the Archbishop and the invisible grace of the Holy Spirit becomes visible through the beautiful actions and symbols involved in this ritual.

And that brings us to the current term, Term 3, where the children learn about, and receive the Eucharist for the first time. From this point onwards these children are fully initiated into the Catholic Church. It has been so lovely to journey with these children and their families.

If you would like your child to be in the next Sacramental Program please let myself or Fr John know asap. It begins next term. Fr John will be sending out more specific and detailed information over the coming weeks. To be part of the Sacramental Program your child must be a Baptised Catholic. If you would like your child Baptised, please let us know also.

The next morning, before the zoo was open, we got to walk around the zoo again, seeing other animals who are more active at sunrise, such as the maned wolf.





## **UNIFORM CHANGE-OVER**
