Working Together for the Safety and Wellbeing of All

A new term brings fresh opportunities for learning, connection, and growth, and we remain deeply committed to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of every young person in our care. At the heart of this commitment is the strong partnership we share with you, our parents and carers. Together, we play a vital role in supporting the development of our children, both in and beyond the classroom. While our core responsibility as educators is to nurture learning, we also acknowledge that you, as your child's first educators, are instrumental in shaping their values and behaviours, particularly in the digital space.

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This week's newsletter places a particular focus on the theme of safety, highlighting the importance of keeping our children safe in all aspects of their lives, physically, emotionally, and online. We invite you to explore the valuable resources and information provided, designed to support you in having meaningful conversations at home and to help us, as a community, foster a safe and respectful environment for every child.

Safeguarding Children and Young People

At St Mary's Memorial School, the safety and wellbeing of all children is a core priority. As part of our commitment, we uphold the Catholic Archdiocese of Adelaide's Safeguarding Children and Young People Policy, which is on display in our School Administration Office. This policy promotes a child safe culture across all Catholic communities, placing the dignity and safety of every child and young person at the centre. It provides a framework for schools, parishes, and agencies to develop safe environments and practices, guided by the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child. We are committed to always acting in the best interest of children, with cultural responsiveness and care.

Our Commitment to Child Safety – Keeping Safe: Child Protection Curriculum

We are committed to fostering a safe and supportive environment for all students. As part of this commitment, we implement the Keeping Safe: Child Protection Curriculum (KS:CPC) each year. This evidence-based, respectful relationships and child safety program is designed for children and young people from age 3 to Year 12. It teaches students to recognise abuse, understand appropriate and inappropriate touching, and develop strategies to keep themselves safe. The KS:CPC is a mandated curriculum, delivered by teachers, and is recognised both nationally and internationally for its quality and effectiveness. Please reach out to your child's class teacher if you have any questions.

Supporting Our Children's Safety – Helpful Resources from SAPOL and National Agencies

At St Mary's Memorial School, we value the partnership between home and school in supporting children's safety and wellbeing. Families play an essential role in helping children understand how to stay safe, especially in the online world.

SAPOL (South Australia Police) offers a range of educational resources and presentations for schools and families, covering topics such as personal safety, the role of police in our community, and cyber safety through the ThinkUKnow program. This term students in Year 5 and 6 will participate in a presentation delivered by SAPOL's Community Engagement Coordinator.

In addition, The eSafety Commissioner and the Australian Centre to Counter Child Exploitation (ACCCE) have released Online Safety Conversation Cards, a valuable resource designed to support parents in having meaningful conversations with their children about online experiences. These cards developed for culturally and linguistically diverse communities and families will guide discussions around online interests, how to handle uncomfortable or unsafe situations, getting help, and reporting abuse.

We encourage all families to explore these age appropriate <u>Resources for Parents and Carers</u> and take the time to engage in open and ongoing conversations with your children about online safety.

Social Media Age Restrictions

Did you know in Australia, the legal age for having a social media account on most platforms is now 16. The Online Safety Amendment (Social Media Minimum Age) Act 2024 mandates that platforms take reasonable steps to prevent users under 16 from creating or holding accounts. This law, which came into effect on December 10, 2024, aims to protect young people from potential online harms.

Welcoming Our Newest Learners: Little Stars Transition Program

In Week 3 this term, we will be delighted to welcome both new and current families, and most importantly, their children, to St Mary's Memorial School, as we begin the exciting journey of school life together. Starting school is a significant milestone, and we are committed to making this a positive, nurturing, and successful experience for each child and their family.

To support this important transition, we are excited to introduce the expansion of our transition to school program with a fresh new name, Little Stars. This engaging program is designed to help our youngest learners feel confident, connected, and ready to shine as they begin their school journey. It is a specially designed experience to help children develop socially and emotionally, become familiar with classroom routines, and begin building a strong sense of belonging within our school community.



Grounded in the Early Years Learning Framework, the program emphasises learning through play and promotes five key learning outcomes:

- A strong sense of identity
- Connection and contribution to their world
- A strong sense of wellbeing
- Confidence and involvement in learning
- Effective communication

Through evidence-based, play-based learning, the program nurtures children's natural curiosity, creativity, and imagination.

The Little Stars Transition Program will run on Fridays during Term 2, beginning Week 3 (Friday, 16 May 2025), and will continue for eight sessions. Families and their children will be warmly welcomed by Mrs Sincock, our Mid-Year Reception Teacher.

As you move around the school on Fridays, keep an eye out for our littlest learners, you'll spot them in navy blue polo shirts with a cute Little Stars logo on the back! We're sure our school community will make them feel right at home and help support their transition into our beautiful school.

We look forward to a wonderful term of joyful learning and new beginnings.

Welcome to Term 2!

I hope the long weekends within the school holidays gave you opportunities to spend quality time with family and friends.

Easter is my favourite time of year. I really enjoy remembering the sacrifices Jesus made for us during Holy Week and then the beauty and simplicity of Holy Saturday where light is brought into to brighten the darkness most often symbolised through the bringing in of a new Paschal candle into the church building. And of course Easter Sunday and the joy of the risen Christ.

With all of this falling right in the middle of the school holidays, as St Mary's Memorial School we honoured these special Church days here at school both the week before and the week after their actual days.

This began with our beautiful little Reception children presenting the Stations of the Cross on our last day or school, Friday, exactly one week prior to Good Friday when this story is traditionally told. Our school body sang beautifully throughout the Stations. Our Year 4 children honoured Mary and the suffering she went through as her son was treated so badly, through a moving liturgical dance. A group of Year 6 children supported the Reception children and lead the narration and slides to complete a moving presentation for our community.

When we returned to school a week after Easter Sunday, thanks to the Parent Community Group, every child was treated to an Easter Egg through a fun Easter Egg hunt. The children were challenged to save their Easter egg wrapper, which now makes an Easter sign to celebrate the Easter Season and the fact that Jesus has risen:

"He is risen" (Matthew 28:6)

On Tuesday we celebrated a joy filled Easter Mass with Fr John and the Glenelg Parish. Again, the singing was beautiful and, as always, the respect our children displayed through our celebration was something to be proud of. Our readers, altar servers and children in processions did a wonderful job and 3A lead the actions of our final hymn.

When Mass had finished the winners of the 44 Easter raffle prizes were announced and the winners of the Project Compassion fundraiser. All up, thanks to your generous donations of money and Easter prizes, our school raised \$4337 for Project Compassion. We also had a fantastic day at the SACPSSA Swimming Carnival, held at Burnside Swimming Centre.
