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ABOUT OUR SCHOOL

St Mary's Memorial School is a co-educational Reception to Year 6 Catholic Parish primary school in Glenelg.

The origin of the school can be traced back to 1869 and the Sisters of St Joseph, who administered here for approximately 34 years.

In 1903 the Dominican Sisters commenced management of the school, until the appointment of the first lay principal in 1982. The school continues its Dominican tradition until this day.

St Mary's Memorial School's philosophy draws on the rich tradition of both the Josephite and the Dominican Sisters with a deep respect for the uniqueness of the individual child. With an emphasis on justice and equity and all that this means for teaching, learning and the overall development of every child.

As a community, we believe that the best teaching environment exists where a sense of belonging is valued, where excellence in effort and achievement is recognised and where students develop independent learning skills and take full advantage of all educational opportunities.

THE FOUR DOMINICAN PILLARS

The four Dominican pillars are inspired by the life and teachings of St Dominic. St Dominic believed in the power of education to develop articulate and well-informed people who could dialogue with anyone around matters of life and faith, regardless of background. St Dominic was known to be joyous, compassionate and prayerful, he loved learning and anguished over the sufferings of others. The life of St Dominic has been foundational in shaping the four Dominican Pillars, which tens of thousands of Dominicans, over 800 years, refer to as way of living a balanced spiritual life.

OUR SCHOOL COMMUNITY

SCHOOL BOARD

The School Board meets once a month, during term time. Members of the board are appointed at the Annual General Meeting of the School Community, which is held in February, each year.

The School Board, on behalf of the Parish Faith Community has the very special responsibility of maintaining and developing St Mary's Memorial School. It considers areas such as Policy Direction, Financial Management, Pastoral Care, Maintenance and Planning.

Permanent Board Members are the Parish Priest, Principal and a Staff Representative, and in addition there are a number of parents who may be elected for two-year terms. No special qualifications are necessary, just a desire to be involved in the running of the school and the will to be a committed member.

ST MARY'S MEMORIAL SCHOOL COMMUNITY GROUP

All parents who attend St Mary's Memorial School are members of our St Mary's Memorial School Community Group. We are grateful to those in our community who generously offer their time to form the St Mary's Memorial School Community Group. The major aim of this group is to advance the interests of parents and children attending the school. This group meets once a month to discuss ways to support the building of community in the school through social and fundraising events - both essential to the life and spirit of St Mary's Memorial School. New members are always welcome.

CLASS REPRESENTATIVES

Our Class Representatives are parents/caregivers who volunteer to help foster good communication for families and to assist in the development of the school community. The Class Representative is a point of contact for the classroom teacher who may be looking for volunteers for a specific task. It is also a point of contact for parents who wish to contact other parents for organisational and social purposes. Having a Class Representative is helpful for our St Mary's Memorial School Community Group to have a contact person to pass on information when looking for volunteers.

COMMUNITY PARISH

St Mary's Memorial School is part of the Glenelg Catholic Parish and we work closely, in partnership with the parish to support our community.

Students and families will have many opportunities to learn more about the Catholic faith, as well as participate in masses, liturgies, prayer services and the Sacramental Program, which includes Baptism, Reconciliation, Confirmation and Holy Communion.

VOLUNTEERS

Our school values a strong relationship between parents and staff. Parent involvement is encouraged at St Mary's Memorial School, as it enriches our community, develops a sense of belonging and the children love having their families involved in class activities and helping out around their school.

There are a number of opportunities for parents and caregivers to volunteer at St Mary's Memorial School and we warmly invite you to participate by assisting with beach walks, reading, attending excursions, camps, coaching sport teams, or helping in the canteen.

All volunteers are required to hold a current Working With Children Check/Catholic Police Clearance. In addition to this, our volunteers undertake an online Responding to Risk of Harm, Abuse and Neglect (RRHAN) course and complete the CESA Volunteer Pack. Please see the staff at the school office regarding the process to volunteer at St Mary's Memorial School.



ADMINISTRATION PROCEDURES & GUIDELINES

ASSEMBLIES

Assemblies are held regularly on a Friday morning at 9:00am in Our Lady of Victories Church.

Each year level is assigned a week in which their classes will host/run the school assembly, which is centred around students learning. As a whole school community, we share a prayerful togetherness and celebration of teaching and learning. Parents are encouraged to attend and support their child during this special occasion.

ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY

Being on time and organised has a calming effect and sets your child up to have a good day at school.

Our school gates open at 8:30am with lessons commencing at 8:45am. Arriving early to prepare for the school day is crucial to classroom routines and organisation for your child. Arriving late to class can be upsetting for a child and disruptive to the children who have already settled into the daily routine.

Please note that the school gates are locked at 9:00am and any children arriving after this time must come through the school office to sign in and have their attendance recorded. Schools have a legal requirement to accurately record children's attendance at school. If your child is going to be away due to illness or family reasons then we ask that parents notify the school before 9:00am.

If your child needs to leave school prior to the dismissal time 3:10pm, please advise the school office and teacher via email prior to collection. All students must report to the office to be signed out by a parent/guardian.

CANTEEN/LUNCH ORDERS

Lunch orders are supplied by a number of family-owned Jetty Road cafes. Orders for school lunches are placed before 9:00am and delivered directly to the school at 12:45pm. Lunches are collected by the children from the school canteen. Orders are placed and paid for via the Qkr! App, available to download on your mobile phone.

Outside of distributing lunches, ice blocks can be purchased from the school canteen at lunch break, during our warmer months in Term 1 and 4.

COMMUNICATION

Communication is the key to a successful working relationship with our school and each family.

Teachers can be contacted via email, however the response may not be immediate, as their primary focus is educating your child. If you wish to have a focused discussion about your child, it is preferable that you email to arrange a suitable time to meet with the teacher. For any urgent matters, please contact the school office.

A class overview will be sent home at the beginning of each term by the class teacher, in addition to regular updates.

Student Diaries are utilised by our Year 3-6 students to enhance communication between school and home.

A school eNewsletter is distributed fortnightly via email. The eNewsletter is our main form of communication and will keep you updated on school information, diary dates, upcoming events and important information.

FINANCE

Annual tuition fees are divided into payments over three periods but arrangements can be made for more frequent payment by instalments

Families who are experiencing financial hardship are invited to apply for a fee concession by contacting the Finance Manager. All applications for fee concession and support are held in the strictest confidence.

LOST PROPERTY

We encourage students to have their name clearly marked on all uniform, lunch boxes, drink bottles, etc.

Lost property, including uniforms, drink bottles, hair accessories, etc., are located outside the Library and OSHC room. All valuable items such as money and jewellery found at school will be held in the school office. Students and families are encouraged to check the lost property boxes regularly for their items.

Any items not claimed will be donated or discarded.

ADMINISTRATION PROCEDURES & GUIDELINES

MOBILE PHONES AND ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Whilst we do not encourage our students to have a mobile phone at school, we understand certain circumstances occur where your child may require a mobile for safety reasons.

If your child does bring their phone to school, it must be placed on silent or switched off, then handed to staff for safe keeping throughout the day.

All smart watches must be in 'school' mode and not used by students to take photographs, send messages, or communicate with others, including parents. If you need to contact your child during school hours, please call the school office.

The school will not be held responsible for any loss or damage to mobile phones or smart watches.

OUT OF SCHOOL HOURS CARE (OSHC)

St Mary's Memorial School offers families quality Out of School Hours Care options both during the term and school holidays.

Before School Care is available from 7:30am to 8:30am

After School Care is available from 3:10pm to 6:00pm

Vacation Care (during school holidays) 7:30am to 6:00pm

Our OSHC program includes a range of activities which are designed to engage all students.

PHOTOGRAPHY/DIGITAL IMAGES/RECORDINGS

While it is important you celebrate your child's participation in school life, it is equally important that you are mindful of privacy issues around the taking of or publication of any photographs or images of other children. It is permissible to take a photo/digital image/recording of your own child but not of others, nor to display photos or images on any form of social media without the express permission of any person in the photograph. Your cooperation with this is appreciated.

STUDENT DROP OFF AND PICKUP

There are multiple parking opportunities near St Mary's Memorial School. To ensure a safe environment, it is recommended that you park in the surrounding streets, adhering to the relevant Council parking directions to avoid a fine.

A designated drop off and pick up zone is located on Milton Street, (northern side of the school) which is supervised by staff between 8:30am-9:00am and 3:10pm-3:25pm. To ensure the efficiency of this area, the driver is to remain in the vehicle with the engine running. Students must exit and enter the vehicle from the left-hand side. Please move along quickly and be alert to pedestrians at all times.

The High Street entrance is available for parents wishing to safely walk their children into school. Some street parking is usually available.

Students must not be dropped off outside the school office along Chapel Street.

The school office entrance is for students and families who arrive after 8:45am to sign in for daily attendance or when signing out due to departing school early. At all other times, we appreciate your cooperation in using the Milton Street and High Street entrances for drop off and pick up.

Parents are asked not to park their vehicles in the school/parish car park (off Chapel Street), as this area is reserved for staff only.



TEACHING AND LEARNING

CURRICULUM

At St Mary's Memorial School, we value learning and our learners. We use the Australian Curriculum (ACARA), the Catholic Education South Australia Crossways Religious Education Curriculum as well as the Keeping Safe Child Protection Curriculum as the basis for all our learning programs.

We pride ourselves on high-quality learning with a focus for each student to flourish as a thriving person, capable learner and leader for the world God desires.

ASSESSMENT

Each student's learning growth is continually assessed and monitored by their teacher. Various methods of assessment are used to understand each student's progress.

Learning Conversations are conducted in Terms 1 and 3 to enable parents and teachers to work in partnership to help support every student achieve success.

Parents may arrange for a mutually suitable time with their child's teacher to discuss their child's learning progress at any time.

Formal records of children's progress are retained throughout their journey at St Mary's Memorial School.

Reports are sent home in Terms 2 and 4.

INCLUSIVE EDUCATION

St Mary's Memorial School caters to a variety of learning styles and needs. Teachers use assessments and the analysis of data to identify students requiring additional support. We do this through a variety of learning initiatives and adjustments, which aim to allow our students to access the curriculum at their level of readiness. Small group work and one on one support is offered to students, such as MiniLit, MacqLit and small group interventions. Allied Health Professionals are welcomed to our school to further support students.

If parents/caregivers have concerns about their child's development, learning progression, social interactions or behaviour, we encourage you to contact your child's teacher.

EXCURSIONS AND CAMPS

All classes from Reception to Year 6 participate in class excursions and incursions that support the curriculum. Parents and caregivers will be provided with all relevant information relating to any excursions or camp, including permission forms. Parent volunteers may also be sought at this time if required. Your child's teacher is the first point of contact for any questions relating to excursions and camps.

School camps for Year 4, 5 and 6 students provide excellent the opportunities to experience learning in an outdoor/ away from home environment that places emphasis on independence and cooperative learning skills. An additional fee is incurred for students attending school camps.

HELEN SCANLON RESOURCE CENTRE

The centre provides a range of literature, including reference, fiction and non-fiction, and other educational resources. All students have access to the centre weekly and are encouraged to borrow resources to support their learning and recreational enjoyment.

BEACH WALKS

At St Mary's Memorial School we are lucky to be situated within a short distance to the Glenelg foreshore. Each week, our students in their class groups, joined by registered parent volunteers, make their way to the beach, where they engage in a walk, run or fitness activity, appropriate for the year level.

TEACHING AND LEARNING

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Our Religious Education curriculum is a living, contemporary and ever evolving program aiming to integrate faith, life and culture.

Contemporary Religious Education at St Mary's Memorial School endeavours to engage the heart, mind and hands of our children in the good news of Jesus Christ, utilising a broad range of resources and artefacts.

We are proud of our rich Dominican heritage and children love hearing stories about their Dominican family and ancestors.

Through the Crossways Religious Education Curriculum all children are invited to recognise the sacred encountered in everyday life. Children not only learn about our own Catholic faith and traditions but also those of other world religions with dialogue in this space welcomed and encouraged. Through the lens of Catholic Social Teaching Principles students learn to value and respect all of God's creation, both people and the earth, and seek ways to actively work towards creating a better world for themselves and others.

HOUSE TEAMS

Upon enrolment, students are placed in a House Team. This encourages and promotes relationships between children across a range of different year levels. Throughout the year several House based activities are enjoyed by the students.

Our House Teams are:

- St Thomas - Yellow

The four House Teams are a colourful display for our annual Sports Day. Students participate in group and individual activities throughout the day, wearing their school house team polo shirt, available from the uniform shop.

HOME LEARNING

At home learning is a vital part of the total learning process and a meaningful way for students to make connection between what happens in school and their own home and family. There is a strong emphasis on developing a love of reading and students are encouraged to read every day with their parents/caregiver.

The expectation of home learning for each year level is communicated to the students and parents during the first weeks of school.



CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

SPORT

A variety of competitive school sports are offered to students across all year levels. Our school enjoys competing in both South Australian Catholic Primary School Sports Association (SACPSSA) and South Australian Primary Schools Association S.A. (SAPSASA) competitions. This involves the selection of students to compete against a number of other schools in our state, at a more challenging level in a wide variety of sports.

With the support of our Co-Curricular Co-Ordinator, along with Registered Parent/Caregiver Volunteers, students are able to be a part of local community/school based sporting competitions, including but not limited to, basketball, soccer, netball, etc.

HOMEWORK CLUB

A teacher-led Homework Club for our students wanting a little extra help is available for our senior students during school term.

MUSIC TUITION

St Mary's Memorial School will provide a space for private tuition for students wishing to learn piano or guitar. Bookings for tuition are arranged between the family and private tutor, along with fees and scheduled lessons. Please see the school office for further contact details.

SENIOR CHOIR

The St Mary's Memorial School Senior Choir offers further opportunities for students to develop their musical talents, with the view to performing in the annual Catholic Schools Music Festival, along with various other performances at the school throughout the year.

In addition, we bring performers into St Mary's Memorial School every year to inspire our students. These include annual Come Out performances, musicals, puppet and theatrical performances.





STUDENT WELLBEING

STUDENT WELLBEING

We believe supporting the wellbeing of all students within our care is essential to ensuring happy, healthy and engaged individuals.

At St Mary's Memorial School, we come together to bring about the common good of our community – a place where everyone's needs are met and all are able to flourish.

Our focus on the development of learner agency and key capabilities provides students with the skills to know and understand themselves as learners and people.

We have a range of programs to ensure your child's wellbeing is nurtured, including Positive Education, What's the Buzz Social Skills Program, Peaceful Kids Small Group Intervention Program and Peaceful Classrooms.

SCHOOL COUNSELLOR

St Mary's Memorial School offers a Primary Counselling Program with qualified Centacare Counsellors. This further supports the pastoral care and wellbeing of students, their families and our staff.

Centacare Counsellors offer support and trauma sensitive therapeutic intervention on issues impacting wellbeing such as anxiety, social skills, grief and loss, relationships and stress.

Our Counsellor supports and encourages key Christian values and embraces the Catholic Ethos.

PARTNERSHIP WITH PARENTS, CARERS AND FAMILIES

We recognise parents as the first educators of their children and value parental support. The partnership between home and school is fundamental to student learning, wellbeing and a positive school experience.

We welcome all families in partnership with our staff to support the overall growth and development of their child. We are committed to fostering positive relationships between home and school.



OUR UNIFORM

The St Mary's Memorial School uniform is compulsory, and all items of clothing should be clearly named. The Uniform Shop is the sole supplier of the school uniform and is located on the school site.

Class teachers will communicate when students are required to wear the Sports Uniform.

Acceptable jewellery items include stud earrings or sleepers, a watch, a small religious medal or neck-chain and a medic alert bracelet. Staff will ask students to remove any inappropriate items of jewellery.

Hair gel, bright hair colours and coloured sunscreen are not permitted. Below shoulder length hair must be tied back at all times with navy, white or yellow ribbon or appropriate scrunchie.

Coloured nail polish and make-up must not be worn with the school uniform. Students will be sent to the school office for immediate removal.

Students should be well-groomed and tidy at all times - staff will remind students of their responsibility to look after their school uniform and wear it with pride.

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STUDENT HEALTH AND WELFARE

ACCIDENTS

All staff at St Mary's Memorial School have completed First Aid training. All staff on yard duty carry a first aid bag to attend to minor injuries. If your child requires additional care, they will be sent to the school office for assistance.

If a student is involved in an accident at school which requires a parent to be contacted, a phone call will be made immediately. It is very important therefore that the school has up-to-date contact information.

In the case of serious accidents, an ambulance will be called immediately.

BRAIN FOOD BREAK

Students at St Mary's Memorial School are involved in what is known as a "Brain Food Break". This is managed and supervised by class teachers. Students are encouraged to bring along a piece of fruit or vegetables, cheese, crackers, etc. and ensure they have bottled water available at all times.

COMPLAINT PROCEDURE

It is always our intent to resolve concerns as soon as possible. If a parent has a classroom concern, we encourage communication with the classroom teacher. If the concern is not resolved, a member of the leadership team can be contacted. Further follow up may involve the Principal scheduling a mutually convenient meeting between the parties involved.

FOOD SAFETY

At St Mary's Memorial School we promote a safe environment for all our students, staff and families. There are a number of students and staff across the various year levels who will suffer extreme adverse reactions – potentially life threatening – if they come into contact with certain food products. For that reason, we ask families be particularly "nut aware" and avoid sending certain foods to school. Allergies, conditions, and intolerances pertaining to the individual class groups will be confidentially communicated via your class teacher.

When classes have 'shared lunches' parents will need to be mindful that the plate of food that is being sent to school is appropriate for that individual class. We appreciate your understanding and care in this matter.

HOT WEATHER PROCEDURE

All students at St Mary's Memorial School are required to wear the school hat whenever they are outside. The wearing of the school hat is compulsory and continually monitored during Term 1 and 4, due to the high UV ratings experienced at these times. If a child does not have a school hat, they will be asked to move to a shaded area, out of the sun.

When the weather forecast for a particular day is 36 degrees Celsius students will remain in covered areas at all times or inside air-conditioned classrooms.

MEDICATION

Where possible, please administer your child's medication before and after school time. We understand that at times, children may require medication while at school. The administration of medication is the responsibility of parents/caregivers. If you are unable to attend school to provide your child with their medications, it can be administered by one of our First Aid Officers.

A Medical Agreement for Education and Care form is available from the school office and must be completed by the Doctor or parent/caregiver. The medication needs to be handed to the school office by the parent/caregiver, in its original packaging, with the child's name, prescription and dosage clearly labelled by the chemist.

We can administer 'over the counter' medications (Panadol, Nurofen, etc.) to students. The medication must be handed by the parent/caregiver to the school office, in its original packaging, with the child's name and dosage clearly labelled by the chemist.

Under no circumstances will school staff dispense medication to children without a completed Medication Agreement for Education and Care form.

Please consider the wellbeing of your child if they are unwell, and keep them home until fully recovered.
